Sermon	Pastor Phil Beck
Silence for Reflection	

- P: We affirm our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed.





Comments from the Cloud of Witnesses

[Elucidating the baptismal rites at the Vigil of Easter:] What then did we perform on Saturday last? The mystery of The Opening. And the mystery of The Opening was commemorated when the priest touched your ears and nostrils. And this our Lord Jesus Christ laid down for us in the gospel, when they brought him one who was deaf and dumb, and he touched his ears and his mouth and said, Ephphatha. This is a Hebrew word, and means "Be opened." But you will say to me: why does the priest touch the nostrils? Here, since women also are to be baptized, and since the purity of the servant is not the same as that of the master, the bishop does not touch the mouth, but the nostrils, that you may receive the good odor of eternal charity and be filled with the fragrance of faith and devotion. —Ambrose of Milan
